- National eGovernment Architecture – summary of all knowledge on Czech eGovernment
- Currently contains description and rules for centrally shared eGovernment services such as Basic Registers, National Identity Authority or Central Service Point
- For the future must contain also local shared services for complex architecture of eGovernment

Civil Service in Public Administration

- 2014 – adoption of Civil Service Act
- decentralization of training
- possible prospective centralization of training
- training in cross-cutting topics (Code of Administrative Procedure, Communication, Civil Code etc.)
- digitalization, sharing of training

- digitally shared services (e-shop, e-newsletter, e-learning)
- service portal - 90% of services can be provided also online
- automation of processes – robot Karel (sorting of received post, administration of grants, generating of letters and invoices) development strategy of training of employees – external and internal lecturers, e-learning, m-learning, involvement of employees

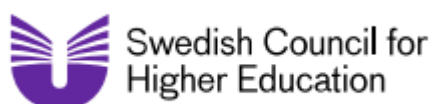
